# 1. Purpose

The purpose of the Sustainability Leadership Scorecard (SLS) is to measure the sustainability performance within higher and further education institutions and provide a framework for continued sustainability effort. This can then be used to drive innovation and encourage knowledge transfer within the sector.

# 2. Structure

The SLS comprises 18 standard frameworks developed to address current and emerging sustainability themes. Frameworks are grouped within four priority areas. Each framework is made up of 8 activities and scoring is given at an activity level. All scoring is based on a 0 to 4 scale.


## 7. What does the dashboard contain?

When you login, the dashboard will display your organisations current score. This is based on previously inputted data from your organisation and/or through the automated upload of the HESA estates management data.

The first chart you see displays current scores against all four frameworks against the targets your organisation has set.

You will see a list of other schemes or tools that have influenced your score at the top of the page.

Click on a specific framework to view the related charts.



## 8. How is our score influenced?

Your score can be influenced by other scheme or tools you use. To select these visit the section on **other tools**. Once you select the relevant tools, your score is automatically updated and you can see the list of those applied on the dashboard page.

## 9. Who can input data into the SLS tool?

Anyone within your organisation can input and update your score.

## 10. How often can I update my score?

Ideally, each organisation should update their score at least annually before February. This allows AUDE and EAUC to include your scores in their annual report.

## 11. What does the tools section contain?

If your organisation already uses tools connected to your sustainability, you can reflect this in the tools section of the SLS. A brief description of each tool is shown if you hover over the question mark symbols. See section 12. For details on how to alter your tools.

## 12. How do I alter the tools we use?

Visit the tools section and select any other sustainability tools or schemes that you use at your institution. The tools and mapped scores will automatically pre-populate the scores in the SLS. A brief description of each tool is shown if you hover over the question mark symbols. Once you update and save the tool options, your overall score will be updated on the dashboard.

For example, if you select NUS Green Impact, a score of 3 will be mapped into the Actions Planning activity of the Community and Public Engagement framework.

<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> NUS Green Impact	A sustainability accreditation scheme run by the NUS primarily focused on the engagement of students and staff in sustainability action. The mapping in the SLS is based on a NUS Green Impact rating of Good or Very Good being achieved by the Students Union along with other supporting actions.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> ISO 14001	An international standard providing guidelines for setting up a comprehensive environmental management system. The mapping in the SLS assumes that the framework is within the scope of ISO 14001. Please refer to the comments in the 'Other Tools Mapping Rationale' text box within the scoring section for further details.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> EcoCampus	A UK higher education based environmental management system designed to assist universities in implementing an environmental management system (EMS). The mapping in the SLS is based on a rating of Silver or more.
<input type="checkbox"/> Flexible Framework	The Flexible Framework is a widely used self-assessment mechanism developed by the business-led Sustainable Procurement Task Force, which allows organisations to measure and monitor their progress on sustainable procurement over time. The mapping in the SLS is based on Flexible.
<input type="checkbox"/> NUS Responsible Futures	A NUS tool designed to assist universities in embedding sustainability learning into courses and the curriculum. The mapping in the SLS is based on NUS Responsible Futures being achieved.
<input type="checkbox"/> BREEAM	A comprehensive externally audited framework for the design and construction of sustainable buildings. BREEAM recognises and reflects the value in higher performing assets across the built environment lifecycle includes BREEAM new construction and BREEAM refurbishment and fit out. The mapping in the SLS is based on a BREEAM 'Very Good' rating being achieved for all new buildings in the last five years.
<input type="checkbox"/> ISO 50001	ISO 50001 offers verification, registration and self-declaration or external confirmation of an organisation's Energy Management System (EnMS). The mapping in the SLS is based on ISO 50001 being implemented.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> ISO 26000	An international standard setting out a common approach to social responsibility and sustainable development. The mapping in the SLS assumes that ISO 26000 has been used to inform the relevant policy.
<input type="checkbox"/> Food for Life	A food and drink procurement standard which takes in a wider range of sustainability criteria and utilises standards like Fairtrade as contributing factors. The mapping in the SLS is based on 'Food for Life Served here' being achieved in the majority of the institution's Food outlets.

## 13. How do I add or change our scores?

Select the area you want to score from the list. This will take you to that framework's scoring page where you can add your scores and targets. Scores are all based on self-assessment and on a 0 to 4 scale.

Select 0, 1, 2, 3 or 4 to give yourself a current score.

To set a target, click into the relevant cell from 0,1,2,3 or 4 in the current target column. In the example below, this account has given itself a current score of 2 (see gold section) and a target of 3 (see blue star).

Use the free text boxes to add an optional narrative relating to your score and/or target.


You can create and save peer groups from this section to benchmark against and export reports. Visit section 15. How to set up a peer group.


View your organisation against this group in the comparison section.

# 17. How do sustainable development goals work?

On this page you can assess what impact you are having against each of the SDGs. These are scoped out at a framework-level. Default relationships are set, but you can over-ride them as described on the following page.

For each framework, select the SDGs relevant to your institutions. You do this by selecting from the download list shown here.

Selections are based on a primary, secondary and tertiary level. However you do not have to complete all three levels, if it is not applicable to you. Remember to press 'Save' once you have finished your selections. You can revert back to the default options by pressing 'Reset' and download your options

The potential and actual level of impact your institution is having in each of the 17 SDGs is shown here.

These are based on the mapping you have scoped out and your scoring within the SLS. Impact is indicated on five levels: None, Limited, Medium, High and Significant.

**Sustainable Development Goals**

Each Framework has been mapped against the SDGs with a primary, secondary and tertiary SDG assigned. You can change these to suit your own organisations mapping. You can revert to the default at any time by clicking on Reset.
